PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Transition from school to work

Traditional youth labour market indicators are often inadequate and do not reflect the difficulties young people face in their transition to decent work. A successful transition to decent work would comprise of all young people employed in a "career" or permanent job that allows them to enjoy decent working conditions.

The Municipality of Tirana and its Employment Directorate developed the project of the Career Office for Youth Employment that outlines four strategic objectives and a number of key outcomes to be pursued for the promotion of full, productive and freely chosen employment for young people.

The Career Office is a comprehensive and coherent framework. It is based on 4 pillars:

- governance of the (youth) labour market, with the 24 Municipal Units
- young people's employability,
- involvement of the private sector in providing job opportunities, and
- Inclusion of disadvantaged youth.

The Office will be able to help young people who are unemployed, those in vulnerable employment, etc.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

The Career Office will be part of the Municipality of Tirana for the first time and it is hoped that it will serve as an implementation model for other Municipalities. It will provide orientation and consulting services for young people in Tirana and oversee their involvement in various projects and programs for Employment

PRELIMINARY IMPACT

The Office will guide job seekers to occupations that are in demand in the labor market, and will assist in removing people who are able for work from the welfare scheme. The office will guide skilled individuals to become part of Community Service, a scheme which we believe to implement during 2016. By providing guidance and coordination on careers, as well as tutoring on beginning a new business for young people, the Office will impact youth unemployment in Tirana.
